THE VALUE OF BIBLICAL COMMUNITY

When it comes to our spiritual growth there is nothing like the church family. I often say that we are to "know and be known, love and be loved, and serve and be served" in our church community. You may be a people person or a total introvert, but either way, God wants to use the church to encourage you and draw closer to Him.

I like what Acts 2:42–47 says about the early church and the value of community: ⁴²They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. ⁴³Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. ⁴⁴All the believers were together and had everything in common. ⁴⁵They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. ⁴⁶Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, ⁴⁷praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

Acts 2 describe the kind of community my soul longs for. We were made for honest, vulnerable fellowship. We were created to help each other, eat together, worship God, and love deeply. True community requires sacrifice and vulnerability. I Corinthians 12:25-26 says, ²⁵so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. ²⁶If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it. When one part of our physical body hurts, the rest of the body feels the pain. In the same way when individuals in our church family are hurting, we feel their pain and are encouraged to come along side of them to minister to needs.

Over the last several months as a church we have experienced a whole lot of death of loved ones, illness, and hard knocks. It has been a difficult, lonely path for the families impacted. The good news is that we never have to travel this path alone. Biblical community makes a huge difference! What a blessing to receive the prayers, hugs, comfort, and words of encouragement as we go through the valley. Together we pick up one another and bring relief from the harsh reality of living in a fallen world. Thanks for going to church with a purpose. Thanks for loving well!




The choir will sing on December 17 and again on Christmas Eve at the 11:00 am service. If your child likes to sing, it's not too late to join!
